PROMOTERS CONDITIONS SUPPLEMENT

The general conditions for the Championships shall apply to the Multi-Disability Swimming events except where varied by any of the following conditions:

1. The Events

The above events will take place at Aqua Vale Sports & Leisure Centre Aylesbury, which has a disability hoist located at the start end of the pool.

Note: Competitors may enter any other events in the championships providing they have gained the appropriate qualifying time, but these will not be classed as multi-disability events.

- All competitors (IPC Classification S1 – S13) & S15 must have an authorised British Swimming or where applicable IPC Swimming classification, which is held on the British Swimming or IPC Swimming classification database at the time of entry. Competitors in category S14 must hold or have applied for INAS-Fid or national classification.
- All competitors must hold a current IPC Swimming classification at the time of entry and a copy from the British Swimming Membership data base must be supplied with entry form.
- Multi-Disability swimmer must have been a registered swimmer of the club in whose name he is entered by the closing date for entries Monday 12th December 2016. The registered date will be the date as recorded on the visible ASA Membership database.
- Qualifying times must have been achieved in the 12 months immediately preceding the closing date (12th December 2016) and may be achieved in either a long course or a short course pool. Time Trial times will be permitted providing they have been achieved under appropriate conditions according to IPC/ASA Laws and Technical Rules of Racing.
- A copy of the competitors IPC Classification from the British Swimming Website must be submitted with the swimmers entry form.
- All classes of swimmers will swim together (Multi-Disability). The promoter reserves the right to combine events dependent on the number of entries
- Results will be calculated as recommended by the IPC.
- Awards will be presented to the top 3 for Each Multi-Disability Event. Presentation will take place at the end of the session.
- Multi-Disability Swimmers will be judged under the relevant IPC Swimming Rules.
